Dispose of Ashes Safely

Fact: Many people don't realize the length of time required for ashes to sufficiently cool for disposal. Coals and ashes from fires can remain hot enough to reignite and start a fire for many days after the fire is out. The exact amount of time for complete extinguishment and cooling depends on many factors such as how hot the fire was, what was burning, how much unburned fuel remains, etc.

Be Safe: Treat ALL ashes and coals as HOT ashes, even when you think they had time enough to cool. Take care to dispose of them wisely. Your house, deck or garage, are UNSAFE locations for storing ashes while they cool and have been the site of many devastating fires. Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container and keep it outside and at least 10 feet from your home or nearby buildings.
